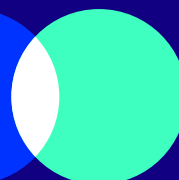

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# Introduction

The Cigna Group<sup>SM</sup> is proud of the role we played to help our customers, patients, clients, and partners navigate a dynamic environment in 2024. We remain dedicated to improving the health and vitality of those we serve. To help deliver on this promise, we strive to be a positive voice in public policy debates—advocating for issues that will better enable a more sustainable health care system. In support of these efforts, The Cigna Group actively engages with policymakers in a principle-based, nonpartisan way. In this **2024 Lobbying Activity and Political Contributions Report**, you'll find information about our engagement through advocacy and political contributions, including the annual report of The Cigna Group Employee Political Action Committee (PAC).



# Overview and governance

The mission and business strategy of The Cigna Group dictates our public policy priorities and engagement in the governmental process through:

- **Regulated lobbying**
- **Commenting on public policy proposals and developing suggestions**
- **Participating in coalitions and associations**
- **Making political contributions as permissible by law**

The Corporate Governance Committee (CGC) of the Board of Directors of The Cigna Group has oversight of and evaluates any material risks associated with the lobbying activities and political spending of The Cigna Group. The CGC reviews lobbying expenses and trade association memberships annually. In addition, the CGC biannually reviews compliance with the Political Activity Policy of The Cigna Group, including the contributions made under that policy by the company and the PAC.

# Lobbying activities and priorities

The Cigna Group Government Affairs team leads engagement in complex policy matters that are aligned to business priorities.

Consistent with our commitment to thoughtful and constructive engagement in public dialogues around the world, we strive to advance public policy proposals that will improve the health and vitality of those we serve. Patients, providers, and employers deserve an efficient and integrated delivery model that creates and rewards quality outcomes and supports private sector innovation to best serve the patient.

Health care policy debates are continuously evolving, requiring ongoing, constructive engagement with policymakers at the federal and state level. The company's advocacy efforts focus on business policy priorities and proposals that improve the U.S. health care system.

**Supporting the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), employer-based flexibility, and coverage and innovative solutions that cultivate a predictable and sustainable health system for all**

- Strengthening ERISA preemption to allow employers to offer broad, consistent coverage in the most cost-effective way
- Preserving employer choice and benefit design flexibility
- Leveraging meaningful price transparency for patients and enhancing health literacy
- Advancing access to clinically appropriate virtual care by maintaining flexibility in payment arrangements and service location
- Expanding broadband and 5G to more people—particularly the underserved—to facilitate telehealth access
- Prohibiting anticompetitive tactics used to limit patient access to high-quality, cost-effective care
- Expanding the list of preventive services covered pre-deductible and increasing flexibility to cover high-value services pre-deductible
- Ensuring administrative service only (ASO) providers and sponsors of self-insured plans can attain stop loss insurance at reasonable attachment points
- Supporting the data infrastructure for health plans, providers, and community-based organizations to better target and address care needs based on sociodemographic factors
- Improving the cultural and linguistic competency of a diverse workforce and health care provider network

### **Rationalizing drug pricing and encouraging evidence-based coverage and care**

- Maximizing private sector innovations to lower prescription drug costs
- Supporting access to higher-value care by ensuring health plans and pharmacy benefit managers (PBMs) retain their ability to use formularies and utilization management tools
- Prohibiting anticompetitive tactics and loopholes used by drug manufacturers to delay access to lower-cost generics and biosimilars
- Streamlining the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) approval process for biosimilars, including eliminating the statutory distinction between the approval standard for biosimilars and interchangeable biosimilars, deeming all approved biosimilars to be interchangeable with their respective reference products
- Shortening the 12-year exclusivity period for brand-name biologic drugs to 7 years

### **Maximizing public-private partnerships (Medicare Advantage and individual and family health insurance plans)**

- Increasing flexibility for plans in the Affordable Care Act Marketplaces to design benefits and networks that best meet the unique needs of their enrollees
- Promoting equitable access by further expanding the types of care and services delivered through audio-only technology in Medicare, where clinically appropriate

- Permanently removing statutory restrictions requiring in-person visits, which limit access to clinically appropriate virtual care services in Medicare
- Further strengthening the Medicare Advantage Value-Based Insurance Design (VBID) model to incorporate sociodemographic eligibility criteria and benefit design flexibility

### **Supporting a predictable regulatory landscape**

- Considering policy and payment changes to Medicare Advantage holistically to better ensure plan stability and consumer confidence, both needed to continue innovating care delivery
- Ensuring any regulatory and legislative changes are implemented on a timeframe that blunts sharp premium increases and negative benefit changes on enrollees
- Maintaining a stable policy environment to give issuers the confidence needed to continue innovating care delivery and driving value to enrollees
- Developing and adopting mature and scalable national standards to provide a “common language” for sharing information seamlessly across multiple health care systems and implementing changes over time to ensure success
- Maintaining flexibility around utilization management to continue industry innovations in interactive decision-making processes with providers to ensure the best care experience possible for patients
- Achieving the intent and vision of mental health parity by improving federal guidance and increasing access to behavioral health providers

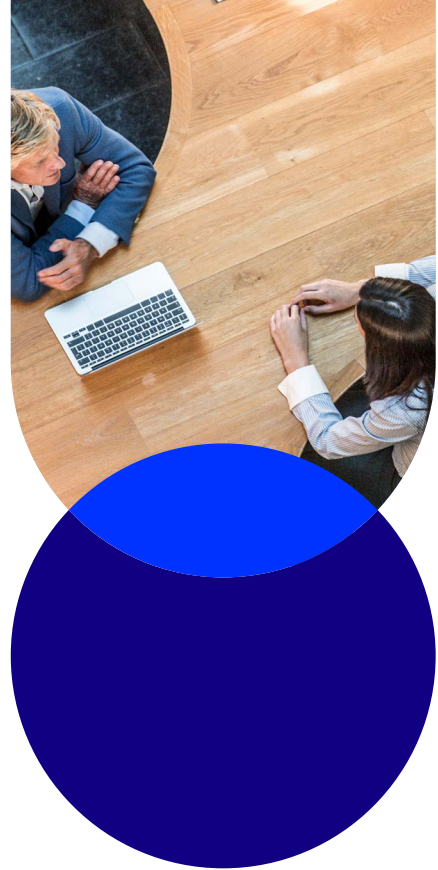
We believe a system where all Americans have access to high-quality, accessible, and affordable health care is possible. With health spending projected to comprise nearly **20%** of the U.S. economy in 2032, the challenges we face to create a sustainable health care system will only intensify. As policymakers continue to debate ways to improve health care, we believe it is imperative to provide legislative and regulatory solutions that allow health plans and PBMs to bring affordable, personalized, and simple health care offerings to patients and employers. The Cigna Group remains committed to these goals and will continue to offer positive solutions and engage with policymakers to improve the U.S. health care system.

The Senior Vice President of Global Public Policy and Federal Government Affairs and the Senior Vice President of State Government Affairs report directly to the General Counsel and review lobbying efforts with the enterprise leadership of The Cigna Group, including the Chief Executive Officer, on a regular basis.

The Cigna Group files federal lobbying reports quarterly with the Office of the Clerk of the U.S. House of Representatives and the Secretary of the U.S. Senate, pursuant to the federal Lobbying Disclosure Act of 1995 (LDA). In 2024, The Cigna Group disclosed **\$8.25 million** in lobbying expenses on its federal Lobbying Disclosure Act reports. The Cigna Group files state lobbying reports with the appropriate state governing agencies in compliance with disclosure requirements, which are publicly available in the respective jurisdictions and disclose the required lobbying information. In 2024, The Cigna Group spent over **\$3.8 million** on state lobbying by consultants.





# Trade association memberships

The Cigna Group is a member of several organizations and trade associations representing the health care industry as well as the larger business community to help realize consensus on health care policy issues that can impact key business priorities.

While The Cigna Group recognizes many of the trade associations in which it participates have broad memberships with sometimes differing views, we believe such organizations can encourage dialogue on important policy issues, constructively engage differing perspectives, and ultimately help identify shared solutions. Trade associations play a significant role in policy and advocacy development, and The Cigna Group believes membership in these organizations is generally consistent with the company's interests, including those of its shareholders, clients, customers, providers, and patients.

All memberships in trade associations are reviewed by the General Counsel and the Chief Executive Officer, and certain dues paid to these organizations may be used to directly support lobbying activity.

# Political contributions

The Cigna Group regularly supports federal, state, and local officials as well as candidates, parties, and other politically oriented groups and organizations the company believes can advance its mission, business objectives, and goals, including policies or issues that support our vision for a sustainable health care system.

The Cigna Group adheres to strict standards, and all its contributions are made in accordance with applicable state and federal laws and without regard for the private, political preferences of its executives. The vast majority of the company's political contributions are made through the PAC, which is funded through voluntary contributions of eligible employees. In very limited circumstances, corporate funds may be used for political contributions where permitted by law and in accordance with the company's Political Activity Policy, which requires, among other things, prior approval of the Senior Vice President of Global Public Policy and Federal Government Affairs, the Senior Vice President

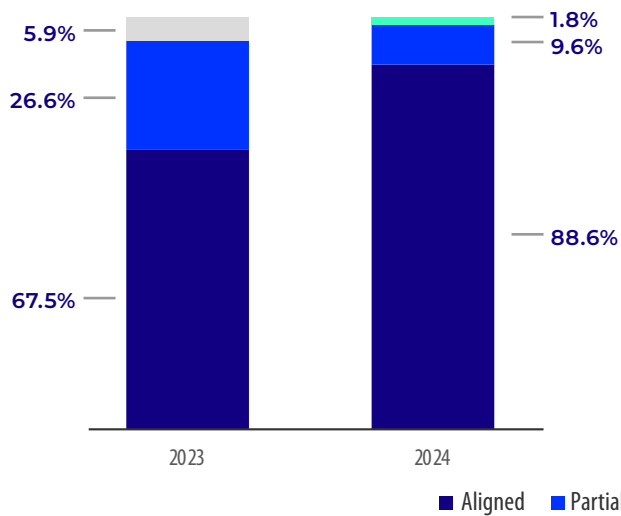
of State Government Affairs, and, in certain circumstances, the Chief Executive Officer and General Counsel. Prior to a contribution disbursement, all candidates are subject to review by an independent third party.

Nonpartisan engagement with policymakers on key business issues is of paramount importance to our ability to fulfill our mission to improve the health and vitality of those we serve. All candidates and political organizations that receive more than **\$750** in either PAC or corporate contributions are reviewed annually relative to their views on the company's public policy priorities.

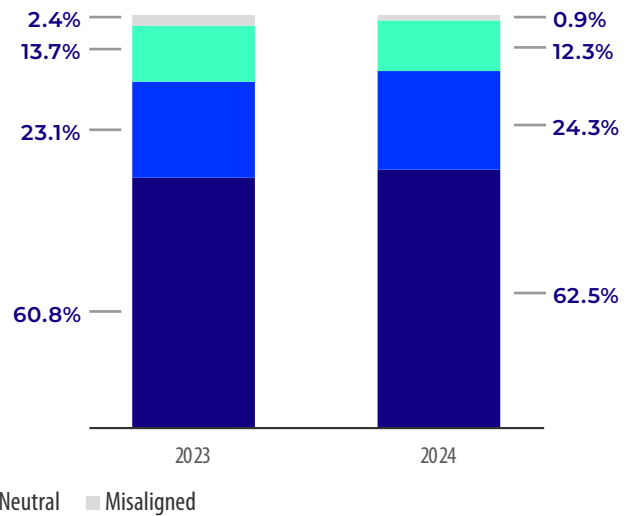

#### FEDERAL LEVEL

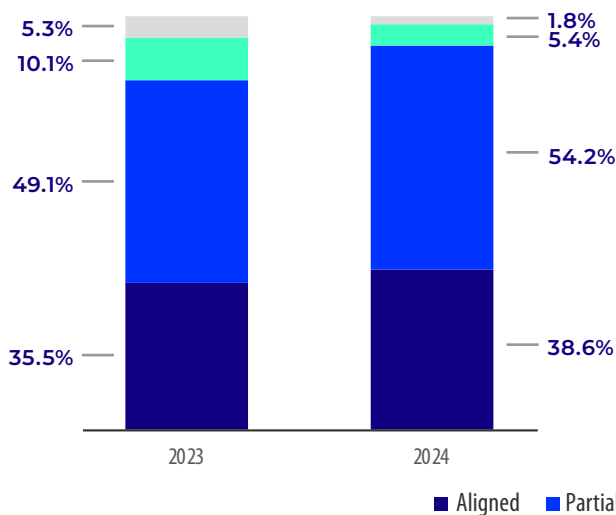

# About The Cigna Group Employee PAC



The Cigna Group Employee PAC is a separate, segregated fund established and operated by The Cigna Group that is funded entirely by voluntary contributions from eligible employees and regulated by federal and/or state governments. The Cigna Group has also established separate but related state political action committees in Missouri and New York.

The PAC supports candidates and political organizations that advance public policies aligned to the business priorities of The Cigna Group. Proposed contributions are reviewed in advance and approved by the PAC Board of Directors, which is comprised of executive and nonexecutive leaders. Contributions are made in accordance with the company's Political Activity Policy, PAC's Articles of Organization, and contribution guidelines.

In addition to a candidate's or committee's position on business priorities, the PAC considers criteria such as:

- A candidate's committee assignments
- An employee or business presence in a state or district
- Candidate viability and leadership potential

The PAC does not make contributions based on a candidate's or committee's stance on any one issue or on any one vote. Additionally, a contribution does not imply that the company's priorities align with every policy, position, statement, or vote made by that individual policymaker or committee.

The PAC also supports national and state party committees as well as other political action committees and organizations. The PAC does not participate in presidential primary or general election contests.

The Cigna Group obeys all laws in promoting its positions to government authorities, and all contributions made by the PAC comply with all applicable campaign finance regulations.

In 2024, the PAC did not support any independent expenditures or ballot measures.

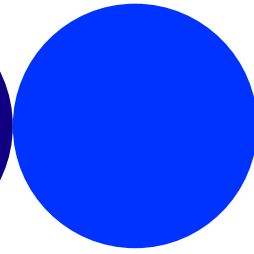
